## SERVICE PROGRAM 2009-2010

*"Be Who You Are & Be That Well"*

*"Do Ordinary Things in Extraordinary Ways"*

**GOAL:** Students will be challenged to do acts of service leading them to encounter the dispossessed or marginalized, offering the students the lifelong possibility of charity. They are asked to stretch beyond their comfort zone to become more aware of the difference each of them can make in the lives of others using their own unique God given talents.

### REQUIREMENT

FRESHMEN, SOPHOMORES, & SENIORS...are required to participate in 5 hours of service **during each semester religion course**, 10 hours total per academic year.

This requirement involves all of the following:

**PERFORMING:** Service hours for 1st semester must be performed between June 1<sup>st</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009.

**RECORDING:** Both required forms; the Service Log and Reflection Sheet...must be fully completed by the student & signed by the Supervisor of the event

**REPORTING:** Both forms must be returned to the student's *religion teacher no later than Tuesday, December 1<sup>st</sup> during religion class.*

Failure to do so will result in the **lowering of the student's semester religion grade by one full grade:** A/A- to B/B-, B+/B/B- to C+/C/C-, C+/C/C- to D

#### PLEASE NOTE:

- A religion grade of **D+ or D** will be **lowered to an F**, requiring summer school.
- **ABSENCE** the day forms are due **is not an excuse**, since the students can turn forms in to their religion teachers at any time during 1<sup>st</sup> semester until December 1<sup>st</sup>.

### TYPES OF SERVICE TO SPECIFIC COMMUNITIES / POPULATIONS

#### *Minimum Requirements for each class:*

**FRESHMEN:** Service to the PVI community [outside of school hours] or any type of non-profit service as indicated below for sophomores and seniors

**SOPHOMORES:** Church or non-profit civic service beyond the PVI community

**SENIORS:** direct service, person-to-person(s) **WITH the poor, dispossessed, or marginalized, unrelated by friendship or family and focusing on the corporal works of mercy: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit those in prison, bury the dead.**

(**JUNIORS:** Justice Service religion course requirements as per 1st semester religion teacher.)

#### IMPORTANT

- Service to family, including extended family, does not fulfill any requirement
- *Parents may NOT "sign-off"* on the hour log unless noting they have directly supervised the service.
- *Students*, not parents or supervisors, are responsible for fulfilling their specific requirements and completing both forms properly. [Forms are available on the, the Campus Ministry shelves in the Library, the Campus Ministry office & website.]
- Only Campus Ministry can approve or make changes to the above stated policy.
